19. Mayor Earl Funk provided information released at the Throne speech November 19, 2019. He met with several ministers and he will continue to advocate for the City. He provided the following:

- They will continue to work closely with Municipal government to provide efficient, cost-effective local government; collaboration together with the Association of Manitoba Municipalities (AMM) will be established to strengthen provincial-municipal growth and partnership opportunities.

- Eliminating the education portion of property taxes. This will be completed over a maximum of 10 years. The average homeowner may see a savings of approximately \$2000.00 annually.

- They recognize that Manitoba must have a coordinated approach to economic development and private sector investment. As a result, The Partners in Economic Growth (PEG) initiative will be launched with regional and sector partners selected to focus on the province's areas of economic strength, including agriculture, aerospace and technology."

- Increase funding for tourism by 25percent.

- Increase highway construction budget to \$400,000,000.00 over the next four years.
